## **Approval of Minutes**

 Motion: Mr. Don Gibson made a motion to approve the February 1, 2024, meeting minutes. Dr. Betty Jo Foster seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

## **Advanced Learning Report**

## A. Advanced Learning Update

Ms. Angela Rigney, GO TEC Director, presented the Advanced Learning Report in lieu of Dr. Julie Brown's absence. Pending grant applications and contracts included a GO Virginia per capita proposal for \$489,381 to expand the GO TEC® program and develop a regional apprenticeship hub. Another proposal, the Department of Labor (DOL) Employment and Training Administration (ETA) Apprenticeship Building America Round 2 grant for \$2.2M, seeks to establish a regional apprenticeship hub and pre-apprenticeship programs. Additionally, grants for AmeriCorps programs and STEM scholarships are in progress.

Personnel updates include the hiring of several program coordinators and assistants for the GO TEC program and the resignation of the REACH manager position.

In AmeriCorps initiatives, recruitment, and community workshops continue, highlighting the ongoing impact on local communities. The GO TEC program reports on various activities across different regions, including advisory council meetings, equipment installations, and educational support.

EmPOWER activities focus on career exposure and work-based learning systems, including events like AspHIRE and internships. The Apprenticeship program has achieved notable milestones, such as registering Virginia's first paramedic apprenticeship.

The REACH partnership continues to serve the community through various workshops and initiatives, while the Wonder Community program offers seminars and workshops on technology and business skills.

Camps, outreach programs, and tours are also ongoing, providing educational experiences for students and community engagement opportunities.

The AL team was involved in various activities, including supporting ATDM interviews, conducting tours for stakeholders, and attending community events.

Upcoming events of interest include the virtual Virginia Volunteerism Summit, the Lead Virginia visit, and the Virginia Rural Leadership Institute.

## B. Wonder Community & AmeriCorps Update

Mr. Brian Stanley reported that the Wonder Community hosted 76 workshops this fiscal year with 399 participants, covering diverse topics like computer training, cooking, fishing, and arts. Membership offers access to workshops and benefits such as free attendance and donations to selected nonprofits. Challenges include seeking outside presenters, while wins include growing membership and strong member connections. Upcoming events include presentations on ChatGPT, Cricut Open Lab, an American Sign Language (ASL) series, a tour of Imagination Lavender Farm, cooking classes, a fishing series, and a mechanic series to teach basic car maintenance skills.

## C. GO TEC Update

Ms. Rigney reported that website updates for marketing and outreach are in progress. Asset Mapping is being used to determine the schedules for middle schools offering GO TEC. A Go TEC guide is being developed to clarify the program's expectations and protect the model.
