<u>Programs & Services / Advanced Learning Report</u>

Dr. Brown's report included the Advanced Learning Narrative report (Exhibit A).

New Grant Awards/Contracts

- \$116,745 from GO Virginia for Region 3 Talent Pathways Initiative: TPM Futures to support advanced manufacturing and controlled environment agriculture talent pipeline development. Investment will support delivery of the U.S. Chamber of Commerce Foundation's Talent Pipeline Management Academy for 35 fellows; update to Chmura's 2016 job availability and living wage study; Futures Summit; and up to three best practice visits to address identified pathway challenges.
- 2. Awarded \$438,078 from the Virginia Department of Social Services for 2025-26 AmeriCorps programming. Investment will combine DRY and PHA programs, adding new Youth Mental Health Corps members.

Personnel Updates

• Currently interviewing for the GO TEC Region 5 Program Coordinator position. Working with the Commonwealth Center for Advanced Manufacturing (CCAM) to promote the Region 4 Training Coordinator opportunity.

AmeriCorps

Dana Silicki, Brian Stanley, and Audia Harris attended the Serve VA AmeriCorps Our Shared Impact 2024 Virtual Conference on December 5. AL staff partnered with IALR's Communications Team to produce a podcast celebrating 10 years of AmeriCorps, featuring the Danville Science Center partnership.

• Dan River Year AmeriCorps: Thirteen members enrolled; 1 exited without completion. Members serve at various educational and community sites and participated in events including the Monster Mash, meal service at House of Hope, the Danville Christmas Parade, and Mentor Virginia training.

REACH Public Health AmeriCorps: Seven members enrolled; 1 exited without completion. A partnership established with Sovah Health Residency Clinic to support community workshops.

GO TEC

GO TEC staff supported Mobile Lab programming across the Commonwealth, engaging students through hands-on activities at career fairs, community events, and open houses in Regions 1, 3, 4, and 5. Highlights include participation in the Danville Christmas Parade, the Health Sciences Summit in Roanoke, and the Maritime Career Festival. Staff conducted interest meetings, provided teacher training, maintained lab equipment, and supported school divisions with curriculum and lab setup across multiple regions. Advisory meetings and lab ribbon cuttings were held in Regions 1 and 4. GO TEC also partnered with industry and educational institutions, including Sovah Health, UVA Weldon Cooper Center, and Danville Community College, to support program evaluation and workforce development efforts.

Apprenticeship (ExTRA)

IALR supported new apprenticeship registrations at Huber (two Industrial Maintenance Mechanics) and DAW Construction (4 total apprentices). Staff attended Virginia Works' Apprenticeship Awards on Nov. 15 and co-hosted a National Apprenticeship Week event with New College Institute on Nov. 19. The ExTRA Awards Breakfast was held Nov. 25, recognizing outstanding employers. Six Emergency Medical Technician apprentices from Danville Life Saving Crew completed their terms and received journeyman cards on Dec. 3, 2025.

Advanced Learning (AL) Updates

May 2025

NEW GRANT AWARDS/CONTRACTS:

NA

PENDING GRANT APPLICATIONS/CONTRACTS:

- 1. \$600,000 white paper proposal submitted in response to the Department of Navy (DON) Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM) Education and Workforce Program RFP. IALR would pilot two interventions to address (1) the gap in DON-aligned GO TEC pathways and (2) the math barrier to pursuing postsecondary STEM and CTE pathways.
- 2. Submitted two Congressionally Directed Spending (CDS requests) to Senators Kaine and Warner: one to support apprenticeships (using DOL ETA proposal; scored in top quartile) and one to develop the Healthcare Hub.

PERSONNEL UPDATES:

- Drew Jackson, GO TEC Region 4 Program Coordinator, resigned on March 17th.
- Based on program needs, the REACH Program Assistant position was eliminated. Francina Jones separated from employment on April 7, 2025. WE have posted for a REACH Program Coordinator position.

AMERCORPS:

- Onboarded three new AmeriCorps members (21 total active members).
- Twelve IALR AmeriCorps members created MLK Inspirational Rocks to spread across the city for the national MLK Day of Service.
- Celebrated AmeriCorps week (March 10 14th) with posts on social media and during Family Literacy Night.
- Family Literacy night was held at IALR on March 13th for 140 children and their parents/caring adults. Multiple agencies and 82 volunteers provided age-appropriate engaging activities.
- AmeriCorps members completed a service project at God's Storehouse on April 15th. Thirteen members and three staff created 29 Children's Play Pals and 13 Blessing Buckets.
- REACH AmeriCorps members provided 10 workshops for 101 participants In March.

GO TEC® (Great Opportunities in Technology and Engineering Careers)

- Provided a tour of the Region 4 Training Lab to the Virginia State University (VSU) Metropolitan Business League (50 attendees).
- Meeting with Virginia Department of Education (VDOE) Career and Technical Education (CTE) leaders to discuss GO TEC course alignment for middle school.
- Attended the Virginia Nuclear Energy Consortium meeting on March 3rd.
- Provided an update on the GO TEC evaluation plan to the GO Virginia State Board during their March 11th meeting.
- o Dr. Brown and Jake Taylor were interviewed by PBS on March 26th for VDOE segment on GO TEC as an innovative program.

- o 3rd Annual GO TEC VEX IQ Robotics Competition held at IALR April 10th; 20 teams with 85 students, making it the largest competition yet. Congrats to OT Bonner Middle School, Gretna Middle School, and Dinwiddie Middle School on their 1st -3rd place finishes. Jake Taylor coordinated the event with support from the GO TEC Team, Advanced Learning Division, IT Department, Communications, and ICC.
- Held the first GO TEC Region 1 VEX Competition
- Held five Community Open House Events in Region 1; resulted in new partnerships with two community colleges and at least two new industries.
